Welcome to Farnham in 2016

Located mid-way between Winchester and London, nestled alongside the beautiful Surrey Hills and historic North Downs Way, Farnham continues to be an ideal location in which to settle. Stone Age, Roman and Saxon dwellings can be found throughout the town and the town centre benefits from an abundance of fine Georgian architecture.

The names of the town's public houses, the Shepherd and Flock, The Wheatsheaf and The Hop Blossom, remind us of the trades on which Farnham's wealth was built. To this day. Farnham remains a bustling market town with a wide range of amenities, services and landscapes. Overlooked by the fine 12th century Castle, the town's cobbled streets boast over 200 shops.

Farnham is known as a town of arts and crafts, home to the University for the Creative Arts, the Farnham Maltings arts and community centre, the New Ashgate Gallery and the historic

Farnham Pottery. It also has a wide range of public art and craft to explore by foot around the town.

Farnham enjoys a spacious green setting with The North Downs Way National Trail stretching for 153 miles from Farnham to Dover along the Downs in Surrey and Kent. and St Swithun's way from Farnham to Winchester.

The town has many open spaces. Parks such as Farnham Park and Gostrey Meadow and less formal spaces, such as the Bishop's Meadow, the River Wev.

village greens and nearby woods provide residents with beautiful recreation space on their doorsteps. Even the town centre offers a range of beautiful trees to discover.

With its outstanding schools, Farnham Sixth Form College and the celebrated University for the Creative Arts, plus the local U3A and the adult education centre, Farnham offers exceptional educational opportunities locally. Its excellent transport links provide access to employment opportunities across the south east

Farnham and its communities

Complementing the historic Georgian town centre. Farnham comprises a wealth of distinct communities and villages. To the south, towards scenic Tilford and Frensham, is The Bourne with its annual summer show on the green and the Bourne Woods which are often used for filming Hollywood blockbusters or television productions. Farnham once supplied clay to the Romans and it is Wrecclesham, with its successful Farnham Pottery, that continues to play a significant contribution to Farnham as a Craft Town. Nearby Rowledge is more rural in character, adjacent to Alice Holt Forest, with a traditional village fayre taking place in May plus regular events in the village hall.

Following the River Wey to the east of Farnham, fragments of the church and extensive monastic buildings of the first Cistercian abbey in England, founded in 1128, can be found at Waverley Abbey. North of the town centre, where mesolithic settlements have been found, is the area of Hale, with its annual carnival and fete on the village green.

As the Army expanded in neighbouring Aldershot, the village of Heath End was formed, now with a parade of shops and a good secondary school. The Rowhill Nature Reserve is a beautiful natural boundary between the two towns. The small villages of Badshot Lea, bordered by four bridges, and Weybourne, once

home to John Henry Knight, flank the east side of the town, adjacent to the new Badshot Lea nature reserve.

Farnham is historically and currently uniquely placed as England's Craft Town with its vibrant creative community and wealth of contemporary art galleries to eniov. The University for the Creative Arts also attracts talented students to the creative hub of Farnham from all over the world. Over 400,000 people visit the Farnham Maltings for exhibitions and events each year. drawing audiences from the local area and overseas. Activity cumulates in October each year, when the town will see the month long programme dedicated to craft.

Farnham Town Council Services

Based on a Band D property, households will pay £59.83 per annum (or just £1.15 a week) to Farnham Town Council during 2016/17. This covers a wide range of services to Farnham and surrounding villages, from free events such as Music in the Meadow; the Food Festival and Christmas events; to graffiti removal; the provision of public toilets; Farmers' Markets; CCTV; allotments;

cemeteries and Christmas Lights. In addition, the Council commented on 826 planning applications in 2015 and lobbies other councils and organisations on issues affecting the area. The Farnham CCTV system, funded by Farnham Town Council and monitored by the Surrey Police, has a valuable role in providing a safer environment in the town and helping contribute to the effectiveness of its policing and the prevention of crime.

Community events

A year long programme of free events is organised by Farnham Town Council to enhance Farnham as a place to live. The summer programme includes a (new for 2016) Spring Festival in May, Picnic in the Park to conclude Carnival weekend in June and a series of Music in the Meadow concerts throughout the

whole summer on lazy Sunday afternoons. In September, the Food Festival takes place in Castle Street with dozens of stalls lining the streets offering tempting treats. November brings the Big Switch-on event in Gostrey Meadow to mark the turning on of Farnham's Christmas lights. The Christmas Market takes place in December in Castle Street and the Bush Hotel, with over a hundred stalls, a live Nativity and, of course, Santa's Grotto.

Farmers' Market

Farnham Town Council organises a Farmers' Market with some 35 producers attending regularly with fresh and local

produce all from within 50 miles of the market. The monthly Farmers' Markets take place throughout the year on the fourth Sunday of each month in Central Car Park from 10am to 1.30pm except for December, when it takes place alongside the Christmas Market on the second Sunday so there is enough time to buy your Christmas dinner essentials. Each month a charity runs a tea tent raising much needed funds and awareness.

In addition, Farnham is linked by Andernach's Friendship with St Amand-Les-Eaux (France), Dimona (Israel), Ekeren (Belgium), Stockerau (Austria) and Zella Mehlis (Germany). In 2014, Farnham celebrated the centenary of the founding of Woodland Park (formerly West Paterson) in New Jersey, USA, with a live web-linked joint meeting, in which a painting of Woodland Park was presented to the council. A tree planted by visitors from West Paterson in 1977 can be seen in Gostrey Meadow. Historically Farnham also had links with Haren in Holland and there is a garden near the River Wey on South Street, Haren Gardens, commemorating the relationship and a visit from Haren in 1950.

West Street Chapel opens as an artist's workshop

Completion of the project to convert West Street chapel into an artist's studio was celebrated with an official opening by the Mayor of Farnham in May and it was a regional finalist in the Civic Trust AABC Conservation Awards.

The Mayor welcomed guests to the refurbished chapel and explained how the idea to convert the chapel into an artist's workshop came from a public consultation into the future of Farnham's cemeteries in 2014.

The workshop is now occupied by Ian Bishop who is a Farnham based designer. Ian works in collaboration with architects and interior designers on creating, designing and making one-off and short production pieces in the general areas of applied sculpture, lighting, theming and bronze furniture. The studio is involved in the Heritage Open Days project every year.

A Farnham eyesore transformed

Over recent years, the uncared for look of the rusted Firgrove Hill railway bridge had been the subject of many complaints by local residents. After two years of asking to improve the bridge's appearance, Farnham Town Council finally got permission to give it a lick of paint while the road was closed for resurfacing works.

Graffiti removal

The beginning of 2015 saw a spate of graffiti in and around the town. Farnham Town Council's Outside Workforce team remove as much as they can and organise an external contractor to deal with graffiti that requires specialist cleaning.

Meet Flora!

Farnham Town Council is the first council in the country to have ordered a Goupil hybrid electric utility vehicle, which will be used to assist with the delivery of a variety of its services.

With the vehicle being very quiet and able to accommodate a 500 litre water tank, Farnham Town Council will be able to water the town centre hanging baskets early in the morning without disturbing residents or causing an obstruction to other road users.

Farnham wins two Gold awards for Farnham in Bloom

Farnham Town Council celebrated winning two Gold awards and being crowned as a regional category winner in South and South East in Bloom 2015.

The Victoria Garden received Outstanding in the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' Award and Nick Gibbs who works for

Glendale and looks after Gostrey Meadow, won a horticultural achievement award.

This was the fifth consecutive year of Farnham winning Gold for its town centre, the fourth time of achieving Gold for the Large Town category and the third year of winning the Large Town regional category. The whole community will be working together in 2016 as Farnham is representing the South Fast in Britain in Bloom.

Awards are presented to Farnham in Bloom winners

The horticultural talents of Farnham's green-fingered community were celebrated at a special Farnham in Bloom twenty-fifth anniversary awards ceremony.

The event began with a celebration of the efforts of local school children, the next generation of gardeners. Farnham in Bloom 2015 was very well supported by the school community with 16 local schools planting hanging baskets

and others taking part in the Secret Gardens competition. Around 60 children were present at the schools' presentation.

A first for Farnham

2015 saw local school children taking part in a joint Armistice Day service with the British Legion, which is believed to be the first of its kind in Surrey. Around 50 students representing the The Fearnhamme and Weyside Farnham Schools Confederations gathered at the town's war memorial to take part in a special service on 11 November.

Boosting the local economy

September saw Castle Street buzzing for the seventh Food Festival with live demonstrations and over 80 stalls. The town's second Christmas Market was held again in Castle Street and the Mercure Bush Hotel and attracted more than 12,000 visitors.

The Farmers' Market, offering only produce from within 50 miles of Farnham continues to be popular and was shortlisted as the best Farmers' Market in Surrey for the second consecutive year.

Building in popularity each year, over 6,000 people enjoyed the 2015 season of Music in the Meadow. The free Sunday afternoon concerts catered for all musical tastes and gave an opportunity for young, new talent to perform. Picnic in the Park proved to be a popular way to end Farnham's carnival weekend again and attracted around 1,500 people.

Farnham Town Council works with independent retailers through Fabulous Farnham and the Farnham Chamber of Commerce to maintain Farnham as a vibrant place to live in and visit.

Grants

Over £70,000 of community grants were awarded to local groups and organisations. Aims for 2016

To continue to deliver quality services to local residents, businesses and organisations.

Neighbourhood Planning

Neighbourhood Plans create an opportunity for local people to influence decisions about new and modified buildings and facilities in their area. A neighbourhood development plan establishes general planning policies for the development and use of land in a neighbourhood, such as where new homes and offices should be built and what they should look like.

Work on the Farnham Neighbourhood Development Plan started in 2012. Since then public views have been collated through online consultations and public workshops. In 2014 the statutory consultation (Regulation 14 consultation) was undertaken and over 2,500 local people completed the questionnaire. The result of this consultation has been reviewed and will influence changes to the next version of the plan, which will be the final draft before it is submitted for adoption.

Farnham is constrained by two areas which are protected by EU law, these are called Special Protection Areas (SPAs). Because of this, development proposals must be able to demonstrate that the SPA will not be harmed. This technical work has meant that the timetable has been delayed as the Council works with Natural England and Waverley Borough Council to ensure that the Neighbourhood Plan is legally compliant and represents local needs and wishes. It is hoped that this work will be finalised in early 2016 in order that the Neighbourhood Plan can be submitted and prepared for public referendum, where local people will be asked to vote on the plan.













