Farnham Town Council has 18 elected councillors who represent nine wards. Two councillors are elected for each ward. Town councillors are unpaid and represent a population of around 40,000. The next full council election is May 2019. Find out more about [becoming a councillor](#).

Role of a town councillor

A town councillor is elected by the voters who live in the ward in which they have chosen to stand.

Town councillors have three main areas of work, which include:

- Decision-making – attending meetings and deciding what activities to support and how money should be spent.
- Monitoring – keeping an eye on what is going on to make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services, and
- Getting involved locally.

There is a legal requirement to attend a minimum number of meetings and to abide by a [Members' code of conduct](#).
