Cllr Fleming, as Lead Member of the Corporate Development and Audit Working Group introduced the draft Budget for 2011/2012.

Cllr Fleming explained the main changes in the 2011/2012 Budget from the previous year's Budget. The shortfall was due mainly to a drop in investment income and also income from the use of burial services.

Title

Transfer of Council Offices

1 Purpose of the Report

To update Members on the latest discussions relating to the Transfer of the Council Offices from Waverley Borough Council to Farnham Town Council and seek approval to apply for permission to create a dropped kerb to improve the parking arrangements at the Council Offices.

2. Background

The Mayor, Lead Member for Corporate Development & Audit and the Acting Town Clerk met with the Waverley's Deputy Leader, Deputy Chief Executive and Head of Customer, IT and Offices on 22nd December to discuss outstanding matters. The principal issues related to the proposed overage clause and potentially restrictive covenants and boundary issues.

3. Current Situation

All outstanding matters were resolved and agreement was reached for the formal transfer of the property at the end of the financial year. The priority now is for the smooth transition between the two authorities and officers from both authorities are working to achieve this. Cllrs Genziani and Attfield are meeting with the Acting Town Clerk to draw up a comprehensive list of matters to be considered.

In reviewing the boundary of the transfer it seems sensible to optimise the space available for parking for visitors to the Offices. The Corporate Development and Audit Working Group have reviewed the options and recommend to the Council that approval is sought to drop the kerb to enable the existing three car park spaces to be driven into from the access road. This will enable a revised configuration of the remaining space to provide an additional four car parking spaces and avoid the need to rent any additional spaces. The costs for doing this would be met from reserves.

The costs of any applications required to lower the kerb height. The costs associated in lowering the kerb (estimates will be sought if approval is given).

6. Recommendations

It is recommended that:

- 2) Members approve an application to lower the height of the kerb to optimise car parking at the Council Offices with any associated costs being met from reserves.

Public Works Loan Board

1 Purpose of the Report

To review, in the light of new information, whether the Council should repay early the loan from the Public Works Loan Board

2. Background

In 1996, Farnham Town Council took out a loan of £110,000 repayable over twenty-six years towards the costs of building the extension to the Council offices. The loan attracted a fixed interest rate of 8.25% with repayments of £5.113.55 due twice a year (£10,227.10 per annum). Members have considered repaying the loan early on the basis that the interest rate is very high. However, the Public Works Loan Board calculates a premium for early repayments to ensure that the full calculated interest is achieved in the event of early repayment.

Assuming the loan had been repaid in November 2010, the figures would have been as follows.

The loan has twelve years to run and repayments totalling £122,725.20 will be made over the course of the remaining term.

3. Current Situation

The Corporate Development and Audit Working Group have reviewed whether it seems appropriate to repay the loan at this stage given the additional premium payable. Averaged over the life of the loan the Council will be paying an extra £1,380 per annum compared to

early repayment but this does not take account of any interest due from investing the balance or the opportunity cost of not having the funds available.

On balance, the Corporate Development and Audit Working Group recommend that the loan is not paid at this stage but that officers review the situation during the life of the outstanding term to see if early repayment may be advantageous.

4. Legal and Policy Implications

5. Financial Implications

Early repayment would result in a reduction in revenue contributions of £10,227.10 per annum. However reserves would reduce at a time when the Council is taking full responsibility for a significant asset (the Council Offices) and retaining reserves in case of unforeseen expenditure is considered prudent at this stage.

6. Recommendations

It is recommended that the loan is not paid at this stage but that officers review the situation during the life of the outstanding term to see if early repayment may be advantageous

Summary of Key Issues

The Council are required to agree:

- How to fund the Council Net Operational budget of £895,679
- The level of the average band D Council Tax for the Town Council for 2011/12
- To agree the total income to be generated as a result of setting the average band D household tax for the financial year 2011/12.

Supporting Information

At the meeting of Farnham Town Council held on 9 December 2010 the Council approved its Net Operational Budget of £895,679 for 2011/12. (The Revised Consolidated Budget is attached at Annex 1 to this report)

The Town Council receives no funding from businesses or central government and funds collected from the business rates are not distributed to Town and Parish Councils..

All services provided by the Town Council are therefore funded only by the residents of Farnham through the Parish Precept and from income derived from the Town Council's services.

PRECEPT

Total Income from Council Tax 2010/11

The Council Tax bill paid by Farnham residents, calculated on a tax base of 17,155.1 average Band D Households, in 2010/11 was £51.06 per year. This produced a total Council Tax income for Farnham Town Council of £875,939.

Total Income from Council Tax 2011/12

The Average Band D Household's Tax Base for 2011/12 has increased slightly to 17,203.3 households.

The Corporate Development and Audit Working Group is recommending to Council that it should freeze the Council Tax for an average band D household for 2011/12. This would leave the rate unchanged at £51.06 for 2011/12 and would give Farnham Town Council a total income from Council Tax of £878.400.

There are a number of unavoidable increases in expenditure for 2011/12 as set out in the December draft budget for increases in National Insurance, fuel, and the cost of the new Audit regime, and the costs of owning the Council Offices following its transfer from Waverley Borough Council. However with prudent reductions elsewhere in the budget there will be a small shortfall of £17,279, (1.2% of projected expenditure) and it is proposed that this shortfall be met from in-year budget savings or from General Reserves.

Financial Implications:

The Council are required to make a decision at this meeting to inform Waverley Borough Council by 21st January 2011.

Legal and Policy Implications

All legal, financial and policy implications are identified within the report

Recommendations:

It is recommended that:

- 1) the average band D household council tax should remain unchanged for the financial year 2011/12 at a cost of £51.06 (0.98p per week) to provide a total collectable precept for Farnham Town Council of £878,400;
- 2) the shortfall of £17,279 be met from in-year savings or from General Reserves
