Major Road Network Consultation

At its meeting on 2^{nd} March, the Infrastructure Planning Group considered the response to the Government's Major Road Network Consultation.

It agreed to recommend to Council that the following points be made:

- The A325 should be part of the major road network given that it is a key diversion route
 when the A3 tunnel at Hindhead is closed. It was anticipated that this would be a rare
 occurrence when the tunnel was opened and the old A3 blocked up, but the Hindhead
 tunnel is closed with increasing regularity.
- There is a missing link in the National Road Network, namely a link between the A3/A325 and M3 to the West of Farnham.
- There is an urgent need to provide a relief road or a bypass for Wrecclesham. This has been talked about for decades but with the increased development around Farnham (estimated at 30,000 homes including those at Bordon); the increasing use of the A325 by HGVs and the significant number of HGVs that hit the railway bridge at Wrecclesham Hill this is now urgent.
- Despite the large number of new homes being built, there is no consequent improvement in the strategic road network that will improve the situation in Farnham.
- Farnham itself has two A roads travelling through a narrow one way system in an historic market town causing an air quality problem that exceeds European levels.
- The A287 and A325 need to be declassified to avoid the town centre.
- The A331 Blackwater Valley Relief Road and the A31 are already at over capacity at peak times, and any problem on the A31 gridlocks the centre of Farnham.
- The Council recognises that funding may not be available for the whole project in one phase and that two phases be pursued. Phase I from A3 to A3I and Phase 2 from A3I to M3.

The Infrastructure Planning Group further recommends to Council that a resolution is passed:

Farnham Town Council seeks the support of strategic partners to:

- I) deliver a solution that relieves congestion and poor air quality and improves the future economic viability of the town.
- 2) Declassify the A287 and A325 in the town centre to minimise the unnecessary journeys by HGVs and others that cause dangerous levels of air pollution in the town
- 3) Secure an alternative route around Farnham as part of the Major road network.
