
#### Welcome to Farnham

#### About Farnham In Bloom



Farnham in Bloom is about making Farnham an attractive place to live and work in or to visit: filling it with flowers and keeping the town and surrounding villages looking their best and encouraging people to work together. Farnham in Bloom is part of the wider Community Enhancement work for the Town with a particular focus in the summer months on:

- A range of floral displays throughout the town and local villages including hanging baskets, troughs and planters with village flowers being watered and maintained by residents, organisations and local businesses.
- A school hanging basket competition as well as fun, engaging competitions to find the tallest sunflower, anti-litter poster, largest pumpkin, best flower grown in a boot and the most impressive scarecrow.
- A Secret Garden competition for businesses, residents and schools which includes categories for the best:
  - Courtyard
  - · Hanging basket or container
  - Front, back or small garden
  - Large garden
  - Public house, hotel or business premises
  - Shop front
  - Wildlife garden
  - School garden
  - The Madge Green Community Gardening Project Award

Since its early beginnings, Farnham in Bloom has relied on voluntary commitment, local sponsorship (financial and in-kind) and support of local authorities and local businesses.



The tables below set out how this contribution has grown over the years, to deliver high standards and ultimately bring pleasure to Farnham's residents, businesses and visitors.


Farnham in Bloom activity for 2019 includes:

- 👫 Extension of the Council's wildflower area in West Street Cemetery.
- Continuing our 'Bee Friendly' project as part of 'Help Our Pollinators' and 'Wild About Gardens' campaigns.

## A brief history



From its inception, Farnham in Bloom was managed by a local volunteer group for 15 years. In 2005, the group retired and the Farnham in Bloom baton was passed to Farnham Town Council. 2019 marks the 14th year that Farnham in Bloom has been led by Farnham Town Council, the Farnham in Bloom Community Group and a team of volunteers.

Farnham Town council entered Farnham town centre into South and South East in Bloom for the first time in 2008 and since then has won the following awards for the Town centre and Large Town centre categories:

- Gold in the S&SEiB Town Centre category eight times
- ♣ Gold in the S&SEiB Large Town category seven times
- 👫 The S&SEiB Large Town regional category five years in a row
- 👫 The S&SEiB Chairman's Award for Post 19 and Bishop's Meadow
- ₹ Silver Gilt in the RHS Britain in Bloom Awards in 2014 and 2016
- ₹ Gold in the RHS Britain in Bloom Awards and Joint Category Winner in 2017

We continue the great work of the original volunteers, bringing people together to make Farnham and its surrounding village's even better places to live, work and visit.

## Projects for 2019 have included (i)



- Free Bloomin' Kids Gardening Workshops over the Easter holiday for children and their parents.
- Bloomin' Litter initiative where local residents adopt an area of land to keep tidy throughout the year with the Council's support.
- Recruitment of New Bloomin' Friends for more hands on help of Farnham in Bloom.
- Bloomin' Arts and Pix a mixture of art, photography and dance projects for all ages to engage in Farnham in Bloom in a whole new way.
- ▼ 17,000 volunteer hours towards the in-bloom campaign from the Farnham in Bloom community group, residents' associations, businesses, community organisations and individual who have helped with watering, planting, litter picking etc.
- Installation of new Council polytunnel largest to date.
- Supplying hanging baskets and troughs to Weyhill Parish Council for the first time, generating additional income.

- School tallest sunflower, best scarecrow, anti-litter poster, biggest pumpkin and flower in a boot competitions continue.
- Welcome boards on Farnham access routes displaying South and South East in Bloom awards and Britain in Bloom award 2017.

## Projects for 2019 have included (ii)

- Twelve rural locations for Farnham in Bloom being watered and maintained by residents, businesses and local organisations.
- Fourteen schools, entered the hanging basket competition and created baskets for Central carpark.
- ₹ New litter bins and ash trays have been maintained at locations requested by local residents.
- \* Project with Waverley Borough Council and local businesses to remove unsightly litter bins from town footways.
- 🗱 Extension of the Garden of Reflection at West Street cemetery and the biodiversity areas.
- ₹ Working with the Bishop's Meadow Trust to provide a wildflower meadow and a community orchard.
- Finhancement outside Farnham Railway Station continues with Forest Lodge Garden Centre maintaining beds.
- Vinyl wrapping of bus stops to simultaneously promote Farnham in Bloom, Farnham's green spaces and 'greening up grey areas'.
- 👫 Working with Waverley Borough Council in replanting sections of Gostrey Meadow.
- Self-guided tree trail promoted during Walking Festival for people to walk around the town and discover different species.
- Over 200 people took part in the Great British Spring Clean and Spring Big Pick Week the largest turnout to date.
- New dual recycling bins have been introduced in the town centre and cemeteries in partnership with Waverley Borough Council.
- Farnham in Bloom video created by local BBC cameraman.
- Winter Festival to celebrate the success of Farnham in Bloom 2018 with seasonal carols with the Farnham Brass Band, who donated their time.
- Specially made railings installed by the Farnham Maltings and designed by a local artist.
- Further investment in footpaths at the town's cemeteries to make it easier for visitors to access the Garden of Reflection and wildflower area at West Street cemetery.
- Community invited to the Greenhouse open day to see the preparation of the plug plants and hanging baskets.
- Recycled notice boards put up at allotments to display planting tips and to promote competitions.

## Projects for 2019 have included (iii)



- Farnham in Bloom float, prepared by the Community Group, Post 19 and space2grow for the Farnham Carnival.
- Hybrid electric vehicle allows for early morning watering.
- Farnham's third Walking Festival extended to two weeks with over 30 guided walks including the North Downs way, The Lanes of Upper Hale, the wildlife and conservation of Bourne Woods, Heritage, Wildlife and Conservation of The Bourne Valley and a Dementia friendly walk to build confidence and improve mental health through outside spaces.
- Joint project between Waverley Borough Council and volunteers in The Bourne to improve The Bourne Green including tree planting, new litter bins and seating.

#### Al Impact

- Over 250 hanging baskets, troughs and planters including a new feature planter on West Street.
- Colour-themed hanging baskets in streets throughout the town.
- Newly planted areas include:
- \* Extended wildlife area at West Street cemetery
  - Bulb planting at various locations around Farnham.
  - Seasonal planting of troughs, baskets and beds further extended in villages including Heath End.
  - Schools' hanging baskets on display in Central Car Park.
- \* Partnership with The Bourne Conservation Group on the management of the Middle Bourne Lane Community Wildlife Garden.
- Hanging baskets put up outside vacant shops to help improve the street scene.
- Winter planting of beds.
- Vegetable and fruit planters planted by Farnham Community Farm outside Sainsbury's for the public to enjoy.
- Carpet bedding by the War Memorial in Gostrey Meadow – this year celebrating the 50th anniversary of the first landing on the moon.
- Gostrey Meadow planting of single flowered plants to encourage pollinators.
- Hop initiative a local community project with hop plants brought and grown in residents' gardens and allotments. Hops are picked and brewed by a local brewer, making a lager type beer.
- Ongoing management of the raised flower bed at the Bourne Crossroads built by Surrey Highways.

#### A2 Horticulture Practice

- ₹ Development of 27,000 plug plants at Farnham Town Council Greenhouses.
- Use of peat free compost.
- Slow-release fertilizer added to hanging basket compost.
- ♣ Use of moisture-retaining gel in all plant containers and hanging baskets.
- ₹ Use of high quality plants, nurtured at the Council's greenhouse and poly tunnels.
- Ongoing identification of new areas for planting including in the town's villages and at entry points into the town.
- Drought resistant plants for permanent planting.
- 🐙 Village flowers maintained by residents, businesses and local organisations.
- \* Passing on knowledge through allotment lectures and quarterly allotment newsletters to ensure good practice.
- Free Bloomin' Kids sessions to encourage our next generation of gardeners learning skills such as seed sowing and pricking out.
- Tree planting using native trees.
- Use of trees removed in cemetery to create new habitats and encourage biodiversity.
- \*Watering is done by Council staff and a new hybrid vehicle has been purchased to help with this and enable early morning watering.
- Tree from Council allotment site donated to space2grow.
- Second hybrid vehicle purchased, one of the first UK vehicles of its size to run on CNG, making it low on emissions, quiet and practical.

## Sowing the Seeds

#### Farnham Community Farm

Founded in 2008, Farnham Community Farm is a 2.4 acre site growing fresh and organic produce for the people of Farnham and beyond. It was started by a small group of volunteers who felt there was a need for fresh local produce and a healthy attitude towards the production behind it. There are now five members of staff and a number of volunteers who help out regularly. As a Community Supported Agriculture scheme, Farnham Community Farm is supported by its members and the wider community. The Farm produces weekly veg bags grown to organic principles, in season and at their best to around 50 families and individuals and is fully subscribed, but they hope to be able to grow this number in the future so even more local people can benefit.

Farnham Community Farm has also brought together local organisations, producers and businesses with a shared focus on sustaining the environment, community, health and wellbeing for a one-day Sustainability Festival, now in its third year, inspiring visitors to see how they could support their local community and live a greener, more sustainable life.

#### Bloomin' Kids Gardening Workshops

Grow your own was the topic for the Council's Bloomin' Kids' Gardening Workshops earlier this year. The workshops were devised four years ago to make gardening fun and accessible and to encourage the next generation or gardeners. At this year's Easter workshops, around 100 children had the opportunity to connect with nature and to be introduced to the pleasures of growing their own. From sowing peas and runner beans to planting on basil and cherry tomatoes. The children also learned about the honey bee and how it is one of the most important pollinators of food crops.

#### Farnham Repair Café

Farnham Repair Café was established in the town in February 2015 and is a collaborative project between The Centre for Sustainable Design® at the University for the Creative Arts, Farnham Town Council and The Spire Church. The Repair Café's objective is to protect and safeguard the environment for public benefit through the promotion of repair and re-use of products as a means of preventing and minimising waste disposal.

The Farnham Repair Café offers a monthly place and space at the Spire Church for Farnham's residents to bring along damaged items in need of restoration or fixing and in turn 'share in the repair'; gain knowledge and divert damaged goods away from land fill.

Electrical and textile-related products have been the most repaired items, but the team of repairers, which is made up of local volunteers and staff from University of Creative Arts, have also worked on bicycles, furniture, baby strollers, and vacuum cleaners to name but a few!

#### Farnham Biodiversity Action Plan

The Farnham Biodiversity Group (FBG) is a voluntary group founded this year whose aim is to draw up and put into practice a detailed Biodiversity Action Plan for Farnham with an overall vision to make Farnham a model of conservation best practice in urban environments. The aspirations of the FBG are to:

- Fully enable the implementation of the environmental policies in the Neighbourhood Plan by supporting and enhancing biodiversity.
- Help redress the effects of habitat degradation, disease and climate change that are endangering wildlife locally and more widely, and which are resulting in the serious decline of once common species such as the hedgehog, starling and stag beetle.
- Finsure that the excellent conservation work already going on in the town achieves even greater impact through a common approach.

The FBG is currently inviting the people of Farnham to take part in a Garden Survey to find out more about the distribution of wildlife across the town. The survey will provide important data for the group and people are already sharing information about the wildlife where they live.

## 2019 Bloomin' Projects

2019 sees the fourth year of our Bloomin' initiatives, which include Bloomin' Litter, Bloomin' Kids and Bloomin' Arts as well as the introduction of Bloomin' Friends, a new volunteer initiative to support the Council with Farnham in Bloom.

#### **Bloomin' Friends**

Bloomin' Friends was set up this year to support the Council's outside team with hands on, practical help from volunteers. The initiative proved very popular and there are now around 23 dedicated volunteers aiding the Council with tasks such as potting on, dead heading and adoption of out of town planters for maintenance and weeding. Notably, the volunteers planted 6,000 plug plants in just two days over Easter and are proving a great asset to the Council.

#### Bloomin' Arts

Farnham in Bloom has inspired the creation of several arts projects that involve the wider community. This includes an exciting collaboration with 'Blooming Art', a collage competition, now in its fifth year. The competition has previously attracted over 300 entries from the local community, resulting in a three-day exhibition at the Farnham Maltings during July. The theme for this year's competition is 'Leonardo da Vinci' to mark the 500th anniversary since his death. Another large-scale project includes a dance performance by The Dance Movement, a local not for profit dance

company in Farnham, called Farnham Blooming. This year's project, funded by a grant from Fanham Town Council, involves 100 children from in and around Farnham working with a professional dancer over an eight-week period to create a dance, which they will perform before the judges of Farnham in Bloom. This year's dance looks at plastic waste and its impact on the environment whilst encouraging everyone to reduce, reuse and recycle.

#### Bloomin' Litter

Farnham Town Council is passionate about keeping litter off streets and keeping Farnham looking the best it can be all year round. In response to a Farnham in Bloom Community Group suggestion, Farnham Town Council has pioneered a new community-led initiative called 'Bloomin' Litter' over the past four years.

The Bloomin' Litter initiative encourages local people to pick an area they would like to help keep litter-free. Throughout the year, the volunteers carry out regular litter picks of their chosen area, which could be close to where they live or a road they regularly walk. The amount of time given from volunteers and the frequency in which they litter pick varies from several times a week, to weekly and others on a more ad hoc basis but at least at a rate of once a month. Farnham Town Council provides all necessary equipment including litter pickers, waste bags, gloves and high visibility jackets to the volunteers and insures the project. To date, nearly 60 people have signed up to the initiative from all over Farnham, including the villages and rural wards, some forming sub-groups in their own areas.

- Clearance of invasive plants by the Bourne Conservation Group including laurel at Langham's Recreation Ground (in conjunction with the Beaver Scouts) and Himalayan Balsam in the lower Bourne Valley.
- Planting by Waverley Borough Council in conjunction with The Bourne Conservation Group of 9 mature trees on The Bourne Green to improve the landscape and biodiversity.
- Farnham Park ranked among the best green spaces in the UK after being awarded a Green flag of excellence for the fifth year running.

- In 2017-18, The Bourne Conservation Group, working with the Surrey Wildlife Trust, accepted a leadership role in the management of the Underdown Nature Reserve in The Bourne Valley.

- Monthly Farmers' Markets.
- Hop initiative a local community project with hop plants brought and grown in residents' gardens and allotments. Since 2014, hops are picked and brewed making a lager type beer.
- Programme of renewal/replacement of street furniture including traffic barriers, litter bins, wall ashtrays, public seats and bus shelters.
- Regular press releases.
- Updates on Council noticeboards.
- Monthly activities organised and publicised by the media and on website and social media.
- Year-round in cemeteries:
  - Bulb and tree planting in cemeteries in the autumn.
  - Log piles created from fallen branches, from winter storms, and tree surgery for the creation of wildlife habitats.
  - · Biodiversity areas in cemeteries.
- The Bourne Conservation Group works with local authorities throughout the year on footpaths and open spaces.
- The Farnham Biodiversity Group has launched an on-line Garden Survey with a view to gathering more data on wildlife through widespread involvement of gardeners throughout the town.

Under the leadership of Farnham Town Council and the Farnham in Bloom Community Group, the Farnham in Bloom campaign has achieved a great deal in making Farnham a great place in which to live, work and visit with the many achievements and developments which have been set out in the preceding sections.

Farnham Town Council is constantly striving to further enhance the town and seek ways to expand the Farnham in Bloom initiative and reach out and engage even more of the community. Plans for the future include:

- Continue involvement of local community from schools, businesses and voluntary organisations.
- Continue to grow upon the success of the Bloomin' initiatives (Kids, Litter, Friends and Arts).
- Run various workshops at the Council greenhouses for instance for those with dementia or small groups from care homes to aid with health and wellbeing.
- To offer local schools and youth groups allotment 'grow your own' workshops.
- Extension of basket and planter installations floral displays throughout the town centre and rural villages.
- Partnership working with Surrey County Council and Waverley Borough Council neighbouring Borough and County Councils along with their contractors, on specific projects to bring synergy and optimise costs.
- Adopt national Refill initiative to reduce plastic pollution and promote healthy hydration by making refilling a water bottle easy, social and rewarding.
- Look at further improvements to the Council's nursery area to include an educational hub.

## Conclusion and future developments (ii)



- Continue to expand wildflower areas throughout the town to encourage bees and biodiversity.
- Continue to expand the Farnham in Bloom year round calendar of events.
- Continue to grow the Council's sponsorship offering, with the possibility of new packages and opportunities to maximise exposure.
- Continue to seek out potential grants and in-kind partnerships to supplement sponsorship.
- Maintain year round press exposure with regular press releases and continue to build relationships with local press.
- Continue to build relationship with probation service and community pay back scheme.
- Continue developing work experience placements and apprentice schemes offered to secondary schools for outside services.
- To supply more parishes with hanging baskets and bedding.
- To consider more sustainable planting projects instead of annual bedding.
- Continue to improve neglected areas of Farnham in conjunction with the community.
- Look at developing and promoting a plastic-free town in conjunction with Waitrose and encouraging the local community to get involved.
- Cooperate with the Farnham Biodiversity Group in the production of a Biodiversity Action Plan for the town with a view to optimising conservation effort in an urban environment.
- Look to transfer on a long term lease, certain green spaces from Waverley Borough Council including Gostrey Meadow and river side walks in the town centre.


