

Current projects:

- Project 1 Short- and medium- term improvements (quick wins)
- Project 2 Farnham town centre transport infrastructure improvements
- Project 3 A31 Hickley's Corner Improvements
- Project 4 A325 Wrecclesham Relief Road Project
- *Consideration of a Western Bypass is currently being progressed at a programme level; depending upon consultation outcomes and the ability to develop an appropriate business case, the Western Bypass may become a project in its own right







Comparable projects (i):

Durham:

- 3 park and ride locations (10-minutely bus service from each location – used by c. 2m passengers in the first 2.5 years of operation)
- Peninsula congestion charge (10.00am to 4.00pm, Monday to Saturday) and introduction of Controlled Parking Zones
- Redevelopment of Market Place and prioritisation of pedestrians across the Peninsula
- Subsidised bus service connecting Palace Green with the Train Station and Coach Park (Monday to Saturday)











Comparable projects (ii):

Waltham Forest:

- 'Mini Holland' scheme, reallocating road space for pedestrians and cyclists
- Non-local traffic re-directed
- 'Last-mile' delivery service established using cargo bikes and electric vehicles
- 56% reduction in traffic (only 3-11% increase in traffic on adjacent roads)
- New businesses opened in the areas, creating economic and employment opportunities













Comparable projects (iii):

Winchester:

- 4 park and ride locations (7-minutely service during peak hours)
- Legacy of incremental initiates to support walking and cycling and improve the public realm
