FARNHAM INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMME

Local Liaison Forums: Get involved!

Businesses in Farnham can now comment on proposals to transform travel in Farnham at www.bit.ly/farnhaminfrastructure. The new infrastructure plan includes considerations for the town centre, North Farnham, South Farnham and the A31 corridor. There are also town-wide proposals.

We would like to hear from businesses about the town centre, including changes to the road layout, with pedestrian space and a vibrant area where the community can come together. A review of car parking is proposed, as well as improvements to walking, cycling and public transport, and integration of new developments like Brightwells.

A Local Liaison Forum webinar for businesses will take place on Wednesday 10 March at 6.30pm. There are also webinars for the public on Thursday 4 March and Monday 8 March at 6.30pm and a Facebook live event on Wednesday 10th March at 12.30pm.

ROADMAP OUT OF LOCKDOWN

YOUR FARNHAM

BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Farnham has been considering a business-led Business Improvement District over the past 18 months. BIDs bring businesses together and fund extra services or improvements, creating safe and vibrant town in which business can thrive. BIDs provide additional or improved services, identified by the local businesses. They are funded by a levy on all eligible businesses after a successful ballot on projects agreed by the businesses. As more business rates are retained by government and spent elsewhere. A BID puts local business in control of what is spent locally.

The business benefits of BIDs include:

- BID levy money is ring-fenced for use only in the BID area
- businesses decide and direct what they want for the area
- business cost reduction, for example, from reduced crime and joint procurement
- mediating with local councils, the police and other public bodies
- · increased footfall and staff retention
- place promotion
- networking opportunities with neighbouring businesses

There are now over 200 BID areas in England including local towns Camberley, Guildford, Reading and Fleet who are all seeing the benefits of this collective investment. With many changes happening in and around Farnham and as we exit the Coronavirus pandemic it will be critical that our businesses work collectively to ensure the successful future of Farnham Town Centre. The time is right for a Farnham BID.

FARNHAM - 14TH IN THE VITALITY RANKINGS

The Harper Dennis Hobbs (HDH) Vitality Rankings 2021 has placed Farnham 14th out of 1,000 town centres. The table weighs up the health of high streets and shopping centres, based on factors including the change in residents' movement, vacancy rates, and suitability to local consumers' demands. Rising 61 places from 75th in 2019, this gives us great optimism that as a medium sized market town with a strong offering of quality independent and national retailers, the future is bright. We just need to get through lockdown!
