In total, Farnham bagged nine gold awards with five best in category.

Town to turn out for Remembrance Sunday parade



Farnham's annual Remembrance Parade and Service is on Sunday 12 November and is an opportunity for the community to come together and remember those who lost their lives while serving in the armed forces.

The parade will depart from Castle Street at 10am and arrive at the war memorial for 10.45am. At 11am, the town will pause for a two-minute silence which will be followed by the Last Post, readings and the laying of wreaths.

After the service at the war memorial, representatives from the uniformed and armed services and youth organisations will take part in a march past. A salute will be taken outside Farnham Town Council's office in South Street by the Mayor of Farnham and visiting dignitaries.

The parade is organised by Farnham Town Council with the Royal British Legion (Farnham). Other Remembrance Sunday services will happen in Badshot Lea, The Bourne, Hale, Rowledge, Weybourne and Wrecclesham.

Road closures on 12 November

Temporary road closures will be in place. The closure time period ranges from 10.15am to 11.45am. The roads affected include Castle Street, Union Road, South Street, Downing Street, Longbridge and Victoria Road. The exact timings of the closures can be seen at www.farnham.gov.uk.
